Apartheid - The name of the policy that governed relations between the white minority and the non-white majority of South Africa during the 20th century.

Savannah - The savannah is an open landscape of grasslands found in tropical Africa.

Game Reserve - Also known as a wildlife preserve or game park - is a large area of land where wild animals live safely or are hunted in a controlled way.

Massai - A Nilotic ethnic group inhabiting northern, central and southern Kenya and northern Tanzania.

Economy - The state of a country or region in terms of the production and consumption of goods and services and the supply of money.

Nelson Mandela - A South African anti-apartheid revolutionary, political leader and philanthropist who served as the first president of South Africa.

What should I already know?

- Locate the world's countries in Europe and the Seas and Oceans, focusing on the physical and human characteristics.
- Identify the continents of the world.
- Identify a range of simple human processes, e.g. types of settlement and land use.
