### **Phonics**

Phase 2 – this week we continue phase 2 in our phonics programme. The class will be introduced to 4 graphemes/digraphs (ff, ll, ss j)

The children will be introduced to a digraph with two identical letters (these will only appear at the end or in the middle of word) Tricky words are words you cannot sound out – put, pull, full, as

## What are we learning this week:

In Drawing Club, we are beginning our topic with a wonderful classic 'Whatever Next!' This magical story takes a Bear on a journey to the moon, using an old cardboard box and a bit of imagination! Be prepared for boxes to be held onto at home, they make for a great rocket!

In Maths we are looking at the composition of 5. We know the children can count beyond these numbers, and that they will be able to recognise them. However, we will be doing some work on 'Subitising' which is the ability to identify the quantity of objects, or pictures without needing to count them. Early pattern recognition will be the dots on a dice, however, the children will be exposed to random patterns too.

In PE, we are starting Gymnastics and Games skills.

On Friday, the children will begin the topic by learning about Space and where we are in the solar system. The children will reflect on our planet Earth as a good starting point.
