#### **Phonics**

Phase 2 – this week we will be assessing the children individually. This will give us an overview of where your child is in terms of their recognition of all Phase 2 phonemes and some tricky words. We will give you a copy of the assessment to help support your child at home. This week and next, we will review what we have learnt so far. We are also learning how to write a simple caption.

## What are we learning this week:

We have a very popular book for Drawing Club this week, Stickman by Julia Donaldson. There is a wonderful Christmas feel to this story, with lots of adventures for Stickman along the way. We are certain the children are going to enjoy this week's plans.

In phonics the children have been learning how to write simple CVC words (consonant/vowel/consonant) such as zip, fish, net. They are really enjoying this extra challenge. You can support this at home by creating opportunities to write for purpose, such as shopping lists, name cards and Christmas cards. This week we are beginning to encourage those that are confident to write a simple caption to go with their drawings. You may begin to hear your child talking about capital letters, full-stops and finger spacing. It is so exciting when the children really see the purpose in phonics.

Louise and I will be hearing individual readers. Following on from the phonics assessments, you may find your child will move up a book level.
