We have looked at using rhetorical questions to create atmosphere; show me not tell me descriptions using ambitious vocabulary; and making great use of our working wall and writing resources to promote independent learning. We are all looking forward to creating our own characters next week!

Our Science lessons have been exploring how we can separate materials, using our practical skills to identify and test whether mixtures can be separated using filtration, sieving or evaporation (or sometimes more than one!). We also learnt about the key structural parts of a river in our Geography lessons this week, before working in teams to build our own.

We have been busy rehearsing for our Spring Concert next week too, which we hope lots of you will be able to attend!
