Dear Parents and Carers,

In our writing lessons this week, the children explored cinquain poetry, which are five-line poems that follow a clear structure based on word types and rhythm. They wrote their own poems inspired by personal interests such as parks, dogs and other animals, producing some thoughtful and descriptive pieces. It has been wonderful to see their creativity and confidence grow through this form of poetry.

I am also very proud of the children's efforts with their multiplication tables. Many have now completed their check, while others have been working hard both in school and at home in preparation for the MTC this week. Their determination and progress have been fantastic to see.

In science, we investigated volume and pitch, exploring how sounds can change and how we can describe them using scientific vocabulary. In history, we continued our learning about the Stone and Iron Ages, discussing what daily life was like and the resilience people needed to survive in challenging conditions.

Our class text, *The Tower*, has inspired thoughtful discussions about cultural differences. We compared life in Batheaston with living in urban tower blocks, such as in London or Bristol, and explored the pros and cons in preparation for a class debate next week.
