In Maths we have been reviewing our knowledge of angles. We reminded ourselves how to use a protractor to measure and draw acute, obtuse and reflex angles, really focussing on our accuracy. In writing, we continued to work on our story opening fire writes. We have been particularly focused on our editing skills, understanding how important this is in the writing process to make our work the best it can be. Our purple pens have definitely been put to use, improving our sentences and making corrections.

Our Geography learning this week took us across the different continents, exploring how and why different countries are more vulnerable to earthquakes. We defined what an earthquake is and then used our understanding of tectonic plates to rank countries according to their risk. We had to combine multiple skills, problem solving, evaluating and map reading to justify our answers. Everyone managed to include lots of our key vocabulary in our explanations too, such as plate boundaries, friction, tsunamis and shock waves.

We are also incredibly proud of all the children for how they represented the school during our inspection. They truly shone and showed how fabulous they are!
